Older Americans Act FFY 2021 Funding Priorities and Request for Proposals

Title III-B Supportive Services Title III-E Support Services for Family Caregivers

BayPath Elder Services announces the availability of Older Americans Act funds for **Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2021**. All proposed programs must address those service categories mandated by the Older Americans Act that target minority and lower-income older adults (considered at age 60+). Priority will be given to proposals which address priorities set forth under the Act, as well as the categories of need identified through the most recent Needs Assessment, and top priorities as established by the Planning & Allocation Committee.

Title IIIB FUNDING PRIORITIES FFY2021

Top priorities as established by the Planning & Allocation Committee:

- **Programs that Reduce Loneliness/Isolation/Depression**
Proposals must be for pilot projects or projects that *expand upon currently funded programs, such as, but not limited to:*
 - Friendly visitor programs
 - Educational programs
 - Age friendly community projects
 - Dementia friendly community projects
 - Culturally diverse social/recreational programs
 - Intergenerational programming
 - Transportation for any/all of the above

- **Programs that promote independence in community setting of the consumer's choice.** Proposals must be for pilot projects or projects that *expand upon currently funded programs, such as, but not limited to:*
 - Homemaker services-housekeeping
 - Home maintenance, modification and minor repair
 - Address clutter, squalor and hoarding tendencies, including support
 - transportation

The committee is also encouraging proposals that serve multiple communities or collaboration with community partners.

The program categories for funding are as follows:

Proposed Title III-B programs should focus on supportive services specifically for access, in-home, community, and legal services. Proposals must be for pilot projects or projects that *expand upon current programs. (exception; legal services)*

Proposed Title III-E programs should focus on respite and/or self-care for the caregiver. Specific eligibility guidelines are as follows: Caring for an adult at least 60 years of age. Caring for a person of any age with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia. A grandparent or a non parental relative, 55+ who cares for a child under 18. Any relative, 55+ providing care to an adult with a disability aged 18-59.

The Area Agency on Aging is currently encouraging Letters of Intent from organizations wishing to apply for funds to support individuals 60+ within our service region. Our communities are: Ashland, Dover, Framingham, Holliston, Hopkinton, Hudson, Marlborough, Natick, Northborough, Sherborn, Southborough, Sudbury, Wayland, and Westborough. Letters of Intent should include a brief program description, budget estimates, estimated number of older adults or caregivers to be served, estimated service units, and community(ies) to be served.

Program funding is for a one-year grant cycle. Beginning October 1, 2020 and ending September 30, 2021. Last year 8 grants were allocated in amounts ranging from \$720.00-\$17,569.00. One additional grant of \$60,000.00 was made for legal services. Title IIIB requires a 15% local match, and Title IIIE programs require a 25% local match of the total program budget. Some programs may be funded at amounts less than requested. Allocation decisions will take into account the experience and organizational capacity of the applicant organization. Proposals which require on-going or long term funding are discouraged. For all recipients, there are grant-reporting fiscal and program monitoring requirements. Applicants unfamiliar with the Title III grant requirements should request and carefully review a copy of the Title III Grant Procedures Manual for FFY 2021.

The **deadline for a Letter of Intent is 5 p.m. Wednesday, April 8, 2020**. The deadline for the completed grant application is 5 p.m. Monday June 8, 2020. A technical assistance session for prospective applicants will be held Thursday May 7, 2020@ 10:00am at BayPath Elder Services, 33 Boston Post Rd West, 5th Floor, Marlborough, MA 01752.
